Ruslan is a loving husband and kind father and also a highly professional pianist. After his family, music is the biggest passion in his life. In Ukraine, Ruslan taught piano and played recitals in many concert halls as a soloist and collaborative pianist. He was also a collaborative pianist in the residency of the Chernivtsi State Philharmonic Hall.

Ruslan's wife, Olga, graduated as a social worker. She devoted the last few years to raising her children. Their sons, Vladyslav (11 years old) and Robert (8 years old), are also big music lovers. Both boys studied violin and piano in Ukraine. Vlad won prizes in violin competitions several times. Vlad and Robert also play chess. They took part in chess competitions several times and won. In addition, twice since the beginning of the war, the boys have participated in charity tournaments to raise funds for the Ukrainian army.

During the three months that Ruslan has been in the USA, he has had several concerts in Quincy, and he is delighted with the incredible sounds of grand pianos here in America. The Ramazanov family is very grateful to the McCoy family from Quincy, who offered them a house. They also expressed their incredible gratefulness and thankfulness to Trinity United Methodist Church for providing plane tickets from Ukraine to America and for help in getting a car and covering repairs expenses. Also, Olga is very grateful for the opportunity to have a job here at Trinity Preschool and for the excellent experience

February Is American Heart Month! Do You Meet the Weekly Exercise Goal? BFC Ministry Can Help.

id you know February is American Heart Month? In order to keep your heart healthy, the American Heart Association recommends getting at least **150 minutes per week of moderate-intensity aerobic activity or 75 minutes per week of vigorous aerobic activity**, or a combination of both, preferably spread throughout the week.

Do you meet this exercise goal, or do you need help? If so, consider joining one of the *BFC (Becoming Fit at Church) Ministry* exercise programs. *BFC Exercise* offers six weekly exercise classes, both in person and via Zoom. *BFO (Becoming Fit Outdoors)* meets weekly on Thursdays at 6:00 p.m. at Cascades Park during the winter for an hourlong walk (or shorter distance if you are just starting out). Taking just one BFC exercise class or walking with BFO once a week will make a big dent toward meeting the recommended AHA goal. And, you'll have fun, fellowship, meet new friends, and get fit! Come give it a try!

he Local Missions Committee (LMC) met in January to review the **Angel Tree** from December and preview the visit of Robin Hassler Thompson from **Survive and Thrive Advocacy Center** on January 15. Committee members then gave presentations on five possible mission projects for the future, and two were selected to move forward now.

Molly Lord, president and CEO of **Big** Brothers Big Sisters of the Big Bend (BBBS), will address our worship services for a Mission Moment on February 19 about the organization and the current pressing need for men to serve as mentors. BBBS is a well-known organization in this community, and we look forward to working with them in trying to fill this need. We were saddened to hear they have stopped accepting applications from children as they have a large backlog of already interviewed and approved "Littles" waiting for matches. Please be prayerfully considering whether this might be your opportunity to serve in our community.

The committee also decided to move forward in forming a "HOME Team" to work with the local branch of the **International Rescue Committee** (IRC)



in settling refugees in our community. Our team will be made up of 8-15 members who will "adopt" one family and assist in many ways—from helping to furnish their first apartment to tutoring them in English. There will be screening and training, and a six-month commitment will be required. We are excited about this opportunity and encourage you to get in touch with Daniel Diaz, our team leader, if you think this might be a good fit for your service in the community.
