Holy Week and Easter at Trinity United Methodist Church

"Since you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above."

Colossians 3:1-4

hroughout this Lenten season, our Trinity family has journeyed together through A Walk in the Word, a beautiful collection of personal reflections written by our own members. These reflections have given voice to the many ways God moves in our lives—through grief, joy, repentance, forgiveness, unbelief, and faith. As we approach Holy Week and Easter, we continue this journey, walking alongside Christ through the Upper Room, the agony of the cross, and the mystery of the empty tomb.

Easter stands at the very heart of our Christian faith. Its significance stretches back to the earliest days of the Church. Easter was the first and most important Christian feast—long before Christmas was formally celebrated. One of the earliest mentions of Easter comes from Eusebius, a 4th-century historian who documented how Christians gathered at dawn to proclaim Christ's resurrection. Eusebius noted, "It was not by keeping silence that the Apostles built up the church; rather, they proclaimed the resurrection boldly to all nations, rejoicing as though death itself had been trampled underfoot."

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Holy Week and Easter, continued

Even earlier, Josephus, the 1st-century Jewish historian, gives us insight into the earliest claims about Jesus. He wrote, "At this time there was a wise man called Jesus, and his conduct was good, and he was known to be virtuous. Many people from among the Jews and other nations became his disciples. Pilate condemned him to be crucified and to die. But those who had become his disciples did not abandon his discipleship. They reported that he had appeared to them three days after his crucifixion and that he was alive."

The proclamation that death had been defeated became the defining truth of the early Church. Resurrection wasn't just a theological concept; it was a lived reality, celebrated every Sunday and most powerfully on Easter morning. The season of Lent developed as a time of preparation for those who would be baptized on Easter Sunday, symbolically dying and rising with Christ.

At Trinity, our Holy Week services echo this ancient rhythm. We step into the story ourselves—remembering Jesus' final meal with his disciples on Maundy Thursday, standing in the shadows of Good Friday, and finally experiencing the burst of light, music, and color on Easter morning.

The Sanctuary and Moor Hall will reflect this transformation: the stripped altar and darkened space of Friday will give way to the bright colors and fragrant blooms of Easter lilies and flowers adorning the altar. The movement from stark simplicity to vibrant beauty helps us experience the heart of Easter, not only in words, but in sight, smell, and sound.

The movement from darkness to light has always resonated with me. Easter comes to us in springtime, when creation itself preaches resurrection. Dormant branches bud with new life. Bare soil bursts with color. Life emerges where we thought only silence remained. Easter reminds us that God is always at work, bringing vibrancy from dormancy, hope from despair, and life from death. I hope you will walk this sacred path with us at Trinity. As a part of this service we will celebrate with majestic choral music, bright floral displays, and the bold proclamation of the risen Christ from Trinity's historic pulpit.

Easter Cross Tradition

All are invited to bring cut flowers to adorn the cross on the sanctuary portico, transforming it into a beautiful symbol of resurrection and new life. Plan to take pictures with loved ones and friends at the cross to share with our community!

Easter proclaims that endings are never the final word. What seemed like the end—on a Friday afternoon at Golgotha—became the beginning of the Church, the beginning of a hope that death itself could not destroy.

Creation Care Ministry Celebrates Earth Day

ow fortunate we are to live in such a beautiful area where we see evidence of God's creation throughout the year and especially in spring, when Tallahassee is at the height of its beauty. Trinity's Creation Care Ministry is active throughout the year, but April's annual Earth Day observance provides a special opportunity to reflect on the beauty and wonder of creation and our responsibility to care for it.

This responsibility is addressed and affirmed in the United Methodist Social Principles:

"We affirm that all creation belongs to God and is a manifestation of God's goodness and providential care. Rather than treating creation as if it were placed here solely for humanity's use and consumption, we are called to practice responsible stewardship and to live in right relationship with the Creator and with the whole of God's creation. (Gen. 1:26–31; Matt. 6:26–30; Rom. 8:22–24)."

Trinity's Creation Care Ministry responds to this call by recognizing that all creation is the Lord's and working toward sustainability inside the walls of Trinity and outside in the Tallahassee Community. Its three main areas of focus are as follows.

 Supporting the IGrow Garden on Dent Street by volunteering labor and donations of nonperishable food items to the food box.

Each Monday morning, Trinity members join volunteers from other local churches in preparing the soil, planting vegetables, weeding, and harvesting crops. The fresh produce grown in the garden is given to residents in the Frenchtown community and to other families through the Sowing Seeds, Sewing Comfort Ministry, which is part of the Tallahassee Food Network. Trinity's Local Missions Committee partners with Creation Care in serving these people by collecting nonperishable food items that are placed in the garden's Blessing Box and available for anyone needing food.

 Providing leadership and awareness for ways in which we can incorporate sustainable practices in our church, our homes, and our community.

Perhaps you've read Creation Care's tips for sustainable practices in each week's News & Notes, stopped by its table at the Ministry Fair to learn more about its activities and focus, or attended the recent program on recycling that the group co-sponsored with the League of Women Voters. Creation Care and Trinity's Justice Ministry collaborate by occasionally offering films on environmental issues. Through the work of this ministry, Trinity has made changes in its practices, such as eliminating Styrofoam cups, reducing use of plastics, encouraging the use of reusable water bottles at events and meetings, providing recycling bins throughout the church, and moving from paper to digital formats. In 2022, Trinity was the first church in Tallahassee to be recognized by the Leon County Sustainable Business Recognition Program. Trinity's Creation Care Team seeks the cooperation of all Trinity groups to please keep sustainability in mind when planning your gatherings, events, meals, etc.

Celebrate Earth Day

 Promoting outdoor recreational activities to experience and appreciate the beauty, the interconnectedness, and the wonder of God's creation.

Throughout the year, the Creation Care Ministry plans hikes, kayaking, and other outdoor activities for the congregation. In recent years, participants have enjoyed hiking on the Miccosukee Greenway, Lake Lafayette Heritage Trail, Joe Budd Wildlife Management Center, and many other trails; kayaking on Lake Talquin; and hearing a presentation on owls provided by the St. Francis Wildlife Association.



Trinity will observe Earth Day, an annual event that aims to raise awareness of environmental issues and encourage positive actions to help the planet, during the services on April 27. The theme for Earth Day 2025 is "Our Power, Our Planet". This theme encourages people to work together to transition to renewable energy sources and reduce reliance on fossil fuels to combat climate change and create a more sustainable future. In small acts, we as individuals and as a church can contribute to making our community more sustainable. This might include participating in community cleanups, planting trees and native plants, using long-lasting light bulbs, recycling, composting, and conserving water.


Meet Heather Watson

Onward Together: STEEP Analysis

rinity's Onward Together Strategic Plan Research Working Group has been meeting for the past two months to identify both internal and external factors that provide valuable context for the planning process. The 2025 Planning Survey was designed with assistance from the Research Working Group to understand satisfaction with various programs and aspects of our ministries and to determine the congregation's top areas of importance. The survey was completed by 368 people, a response rate of almost 40%.

The workgroup reviewed the survey results to determine what the congregation most valued and how well we are doing in those areas. The alignment of value and satisfaction is an important internal (congregational) guide to areas of emphasis and potential improvement. Demographic information captured in this process allowed the group to dig into differences in experience and expectations based on congregant age, preferred worship service, family status, and other dimensions. The survey also included some open-ended questions that gave the work group additional insight into impressions about where we stand as a church community.

In addition to assessing these internal factors, the Research Working Group conducted an external scan to consider what challenges and opportunities we might face as a church in the coming years due to external forces driven by five key categories (Social, Technological, Economic, Environmental, and Political factors). This report is not intended to be exhaustive but is rather a scan of the most relevant facts, trends, and issues that we anticipate will have the highest impact on the church's five-year capacity to serve current and emerging needs of members and non-members who would benefit from the sustained delivery of our mission.

A couple members of the working group researched each factor and identified a few sub-topics of importance for additional research. The research included summaries of external factors and salient insights that were then evaluated in terms of their applicability to Trinity UMC. Some examples are: current models of faith formation for youth; attendance at virtual church and the different models; best practices for financial feasibility of churches; the rise of the unchurched and disaffiliated populations; and gathered versus scattered churches. From this research, the group identified the relevance to Trinity and the opportunities and risks associated with trying to build or change programming in these areas.

This research was summarized into an External Scan presentation that was presented to the Strategic Plan Task Force. With the approval and direction of the task force, the Research Working Group developed a set of strategic drivers that were derived from the survey results and the external research. To build these, the group sought to leverage identified strengths of Trinity UMC and then listed ways to build capacity for future development and opportunities for growth. Finally, we proposed ways to innovate solutions to some of the longer-range strategic factors we identified in our research. Think about these strategic drivers as very high-level representations that will be used to frame the art of the possible, details of which will be identified at Onward Planning Day in May.


